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PREREQUISITES

1. Be an active staff member/supporter of an Ambassador or Young Adults Ministry (Senior Youth Ministry)
2. Complete the 10 Hour Senior Youth Seminars.
3. Submit your certificate (BA Theology/Religion or MDiv from any registered and accredited Adventist University to the Instructor/Youth Director.)

6. The Need for Specialized Youth Ministry
7. Creative Youth Ministry (to include programming)
8. Maximizing the Opportunities Offered by Social Media While Circumventing Its Hazards

10. Understanding the Youth

YOU AND GOD

1. Summarize, critique, and evaluate (500 words or 10 minutes recording) the eWeek of Prayer of the current year. (Facebook: GC Youth Ministries)
2. Assist a Senior youth to discover their Spiritual Gifts by taking the test found on <https://youth.adventist.org/Resources/Spiritual-Gifts-Assessment> and challenge them to use their spiritual gifts to serve God and others. Write a brief report on your experience, 250 words or a 5-minute recording.
3. Write a brief summary of your own spiritual gifts and indicate how you are using these gifts to lead youth to Jesus.



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YOU AND YOU

1. Prepare a creative presentation on Colossians 1:16 that challenges senior youth to develop their own life vision and mission.
2. Develop and conduct three creative worship sessions for Ambassadors or Young Adults or Public Campus students.
3. Participate in a personal physical fitness plan by completing one of the following:
 - The physical components of the AY Silver Award. If you already have the AY Silver Award, then move on to the AY Gold Award.
 - A College physical fitness program.
 - A personal physical fitness program based on a fitness book of your choice or a workout program in consultation with your Conference/ Mission Youth Ministries Director or the designated Pastor/Qualified Youth Ministries Leader.
4. Submit a paper (250 words) or do a recording (5 mins) reflecting on the principles of Conflict Management and Resolution found at <https://www.adventisteducators.org/2018/07/conflict-management>.
5. Complete the Personality test at <https://www.16personalities.com/free-personality-test>. Print the results and discuss them with your mentor focusing on implications on your leadership.

YOU AND YOUTH

1. Facilitate dialogues in Small Groups (for 30 minutes on 10 chosen topics) and submit a Reaction Paper (1000 words) or Recording (20 minutes) on your experience focusing on the approach and tools you would use to teach and explain the stance (Biblical) of the church.

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YOU AND THE CHURCH

1. Participate fully in the Youth Initiatives of Global Church or the Higher Organization (Global Youth Day, PCM Day, Youth Week of Prayer, Youth Commitment Day, Home Coming Sabbath, etc.)
2. Plan and direct/co-direct a weekend church or campus Senior Youth retreat or a Spiritual Emphasis week for youth. Where necessary subdivide the group.
3. Plan and direct at least two Senior Youth recreational activities covering a total time for span at least six hours. Where necessary subdivide the group.
4. Read the book, "The AY Story."

YOU AND THE COMMUNITY

1. Identify 10 needs in your community.
2. Develop a plan on how to be relevant for your community.
3. Direct or co-direct a community Better Living or Youth Alive for a minimum of three days.
